Associate Pastor of Students Job Description First Baptist Church, Festus/ Crystal City

Summary of Position: The Associate Pastor of Students is responsible for the evangelism, edification and spiritual enrichment of Junior and Senior High students (Grades 7-12) with the goal of our students becoming devoted followers of Jesus Christ.

Qualifications and Position Requirements:

- 1. One who exhibits a personal and growing relationship with God, a teachable spirit, and a healthy family life.
- 2. One who possesses a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree in a related field (Master's Degree preferred), experience in Junior and Senior High youth ministry, basic administrative skills and a personal spiritual life congruent with Biblical mandates for leaders.
- 3. One who is capable of creating and executing a long term vision for FBCFCC Student Ministry.
- 4. One who is gifted and is called to Student Ministry, loves young people, and has a passion for evangelism and outreach, both personally and at the ministry level.
- 5. One who is an engaging teacher, with a strong Biblical and theological background, who is in agreement with FBCFCC statement of faith.
- 6. One who is a self-motivated leader, capable of casting and imparting vision for ministry.
- 7. One who possesses relational skills with students, parents, and staff and has proven ability to build and lead teams.

Characteristic Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Lead and organize effective Student Ministry implementing fellowship, worship, Biblical teaching, discipleship, and evangelism, as well as ministry and mission opportunities.
- 2. Recruit, train, and shepherd volunteer Student Ministry staff with diverse gifts and personalities.
- 3. Provide counseling and spiritual direction to students on an individual basis.
- 4. Maintain contact with students and parents, keeping them informed of ongoing activities. Keep parents updated on ministry strategies and plans in a way that encourages partnership and involvement.
- 5. Support FBCFCC parents in effectively fulfilling their Christian parenting roles, in concert with other pastoral staff.

- 6. Assist in the development and oversight of the Student Ministry budget; also manage student fees for events and trips in a timely fashion.
- 7. Seek to integrate Student Ministry into all phases of church life to create a culture that is intentionally intergenerational, striving to unite with and complement other church ministries.
- 8. Participate as needed or requested in the evaluation and development of the overall church ministry.
- 9. Other duties as required.

Expectations:

- 1. Grow FBCFCC Student Ministry in meaningful ways.
- 2. Be mentored by the Senior Pastor, remaining accountable and responsive to his oversight of the Student Pastor's ministry.
- 3. Attend staff meetings on a weekly basis.
- 4. Present semi-annual ministry updates and goals for the coming year to staff supervisor.
- 5. Participate in a yearly job performance review.
- 6. Present a yearly Student Ministry budget proposal.
- 7. Stay current with Student Ministry practices by reading, attending student leadership conferences, etc.
